School of Metal Bashers  By providing volunteering, practical technology hardware and software training this project creates an opportunity for individuals to learn valuable work skills as well as help others in the community. The project will promote integration by tackling lack of access to education, skills, or employment by offering easy free registration. Digital inclusion will offer increased life chances by improving access to online learning for those that are disadvantaged the most, such as migrants and asylum seekers. The project will train individuals to repair and repurpose technology donations for redistribution within the community. Participation in the learning programme will help develop technical, specialist language used in the technology sectors as well help improve basic English and communication skills that is embedded into the course. The project will nurture integration and community cohesion by people working together with a common purpose either as a student or volunteer irrespective of racial background, faith, gender, age or sexuality. Free2B-Me Community Garden aims to utilise a shared community garden as a means of bringing people together from different backgrounds, cultures, abilities and ages to work as a team with shared environmental goals. It will also encourage interaction, reduce social isolation and improve participants' mental health and self-confidence.  Free2Bme is a local LGBTQ+ community organisation within the Bradford district. This project will see the opening of the district's first LGBTQ+ Community Garden, which will facilitate the positive interactions between people from the LGBTQ+ communities, marginalised groups such as BAME, Women, Asylum Seekers & Refugees, the elderly, people with disabilities, and LGBTQ+ people from the wider Bradford community.  The Community Garden will create shared ownership, shared interests and shared goals which can help forge relationships between groups some of whom have previously experienced difficulties in understanding each other's perspectives. Let's Talk About It is a 10 week program designed and led by the Bradford				
Hate Crime Alliance. The program will provide an arena for regular discussion, reflection and time to explore issues that have a direct impact				
on our daily lives. Issues such as racism, white supremacy and where				
prejudice and unconscious bias comes from within our society and within				





ourselves.  This program will be aimed at people from outlined areas of the Bradford district, and will be two discussion groups, each made up of twelve participants. The groups will meet on a bi-weekly basis over a ten week period in Bradford.  The core aims of the project are to create a brave space that encourages the participants to take initiative in this discussion, reflection and exploration & to explore the impact of racism and extremist narratives on people within our community.				
Young Peacemakers  Young Peacemakers is a 20 weeks peace education programme for young people (8-15 Years old), aiming to inspire and empower them with changemaking and peacemaking skills to act and change themselves, families, communities, and the world. The programme explores concepts such as peace, justice, equality, human rights, democracy, global citizenship, conflict-resolution and reconciliation, as well as the serious of challenges of climate change, Black lives matter, poverty, refugee crises, war, colonialism, Islamophobia, terrorism, xenophobia, racism, violence against women, and bullying. Friends of Bradford Moor Park Project  The Friends of Bradford Moor Park project will bring together communities and individuals from all walks of life and backgrounds - promoting interaction, dialogue and understanding between them. It aims to bring the whole community that surrounds the park together to use this new space, encourage them to take ownership of it and to look after protect and develop it – creating a sustainable green space long into the future.  The project will run sessions in the park around topics such as restoration and development (including tree planting, and developing a community garden), exercise (including learn to cycle, walking and running clubs) and mental health.
